Gentlemen,

We are writing this letter to voice our concerns regarding the new plantings around the edge of the pond that abuts the 5<sup>th</sup> hole of the "Sound" golf course and along Classics Ct. in Palmetto Dunes of Pelican Sound. My wife and I have lived here in Palmetto Dunes since 2001. Our concern is for the negative effect these plants may cause to the egress the wildlife currently has, direct from the pond edge to the water. Many species of birds, turtles and alligators use the unobstructed access to the pond for egress and feeding around the perimeter. Turtles and alligators walk ashore to sun themselves and many types of birds (Herrings, Cormorants, Anhingas, storks, Egrets, etc.) feed at the shoreline for small fish, frogs, etc. If this plant life grows and gets dense like it currently is on the fairway side of the pond these animals will not be able to continue to have free access from the shore and we will also lose the opportunity to observe them as we currently do.

In all the time we have lived here we have never had a problem with erosion of the shoreline. We do not understand the reasoning for these plantings? We would request that the plantings along the north and east sides of the pond across from the fairway be removed or allow us to do so. We have attached some photos of the wildlife's use of the ponds unobstructed edges for your review and consideration. We would much rather see the actions of the wildlife instead of plants.

#### Good Morning,

My husband Tom and I have lived in Pelican Sound for 19 years. We chose our lot in Palmetto Dunes community carefully in 2001. The view from our lanai was very important to us. For 19 years we have enjoyed the lake, which is on Sound #5 of the Sound course, and 20 feet from our lanai. We are on the ground floor of our carriage home. Our friends have commented that we have the best view of anyone. We thoroughly enjoy the numerous variety of shore birds, turtles carrying their babies on their backs, osprey that dive for fish, and of course the alligators that come visit once in awhile. My husband cannot play golf, tennis or go boating and fishing anymore due to health issues. He spends many of his hours a day on the lanai enjoying the birds, wild life, and nature.

In 19 years our lake water has had no problem with impurities. We have beautiful large bass in the lake and birds are always here. Recently while having coffee on the lanai, there was a stork, a couple of Marsh Hens, a Great Blue Heron, two ducks, a couple of different kinds of ibis. What a beautiful site! It is very unkind of River Ridge to take this away from us after 19 years.

As far as erosion control goes, we have many grown Cypress trees on the banks by the golf green, which are doing a great job for the erosion problem.

I encourage you to visit #1 of the lakes course here at Pelican Sound. You will not see one single bird or turtle around the lake. It is surrounded by these invasive lilies and reeds, and the area of the lake has gotten smaller every year. There is no shore line for the birds.

I expect there are other species of plants that could achieve the same objective without doing so much damage to the aesthetics of our beautiful pond.

I ask you to please consider to remove the lilies and reeds so my husband and I, and all that live around the lake can continue to enjoy the beauty we have had in the past 19 years. Ask yourself, would you like to have this taken away from you?

River Ridge recently planted more reeds on the edge which when fully grown will be a wall between the residence and the water. This cuts off all the wading birds and access to any fishing. I have visited other communities and they don't seem to have any of these problems. Please allow the owners to enjoy the water without putting up this wall, we finally got rid of the saw palmettos let's not make the same mistake.

We the residence of Pelican Sound along the shore line of H1C (Sound #5 Golf Course)

have continued to no avail to resolve the issue of littoral plantings.

#### Our reasons are as follows:

- 1. The latest plantings will cut off access to lake birds wading, fishing, maintenance of this area of the lake.
- 2. Harboring of mosquitoes and terrible odor
- 3. Increase of algae which they are supposed to prevent but again increased since the latest planting
- 4.Plants are 30 feet from our building to water which puts a 4 to 5 foot wall when fully grown
- 5. Harboring of snakes palmetto rats.
- 6.We have had no visible erosion on this side of the lake
- 7. Very little fertilizer run off on residence side

As residence of Pelican Sound we have noted less and less lake and pond area because of the continued overgrowth of plantings

- 59 them out to the end of the monument and install the pavers up to the edge of its right-of-way
- 60 (ROW); the HOS would fund its share of the cost.
- This would be a Phase 2 project along with Pinehurst and the Corkscrew roundabout.

As to how much was available for unforeseen expenses, Mr. Adams stated very little and reiterated that \$65,000 was set aside for the catch basins. While there are contingency funds that would cover the difference, it was not a significant amount.
