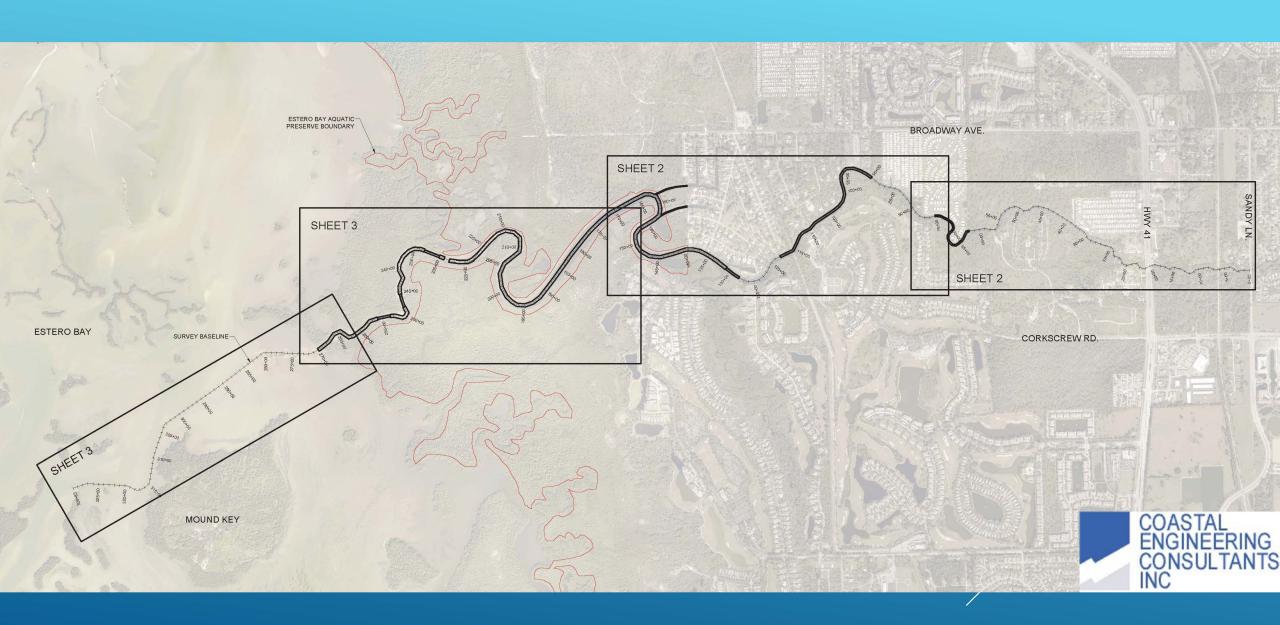


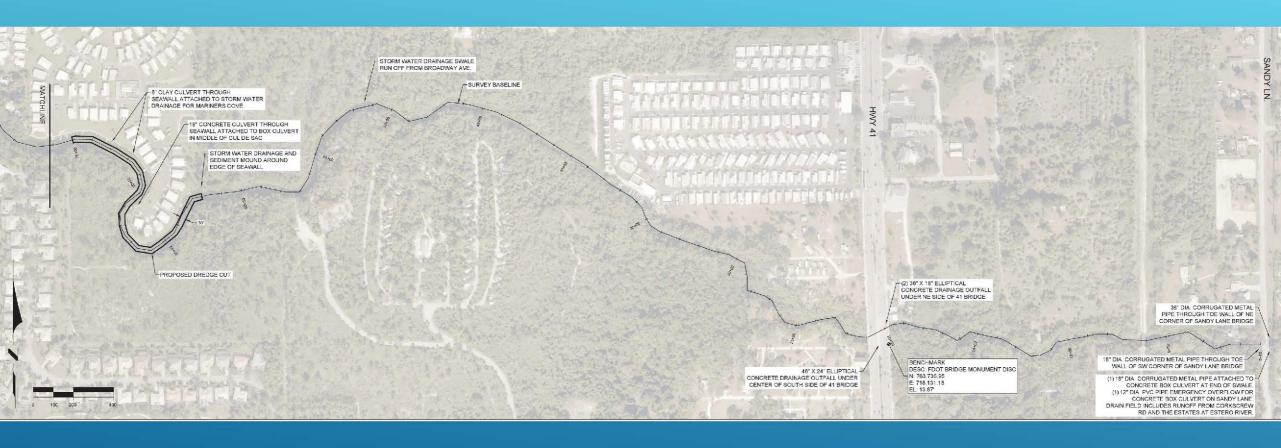

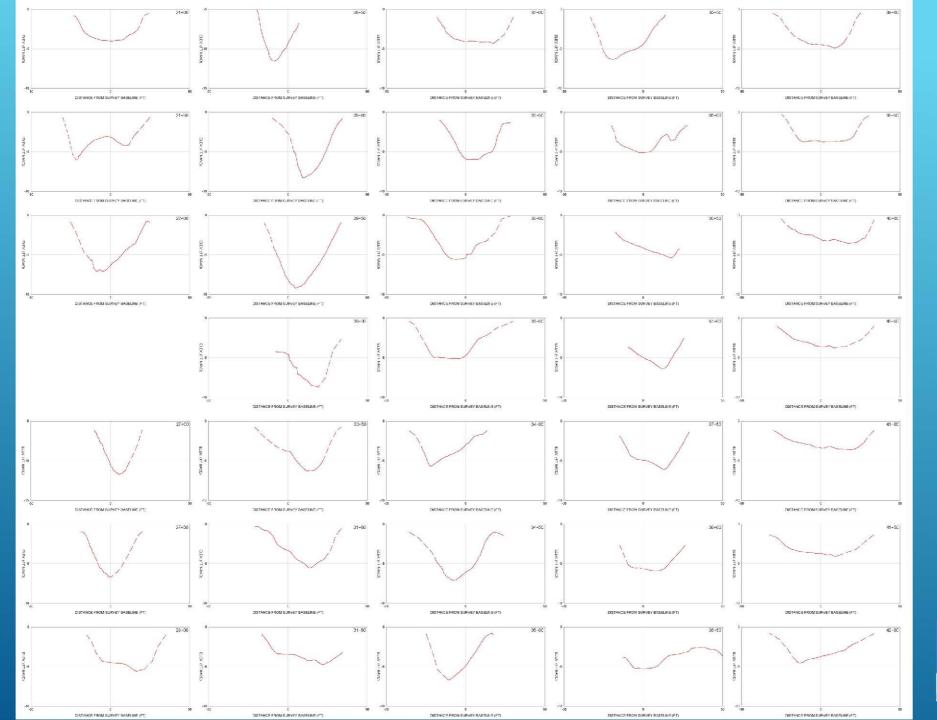


- Channel obstructions to navigation from Stations 0+00 to 34+00 (Sandy Lane Bridge to Sunny Grove docks) are downed tree limbs and low hanging branches.
- Lee County is partnering with SFWMD to remove debris in the reach from Sunny Grove to US 41 Bridge in 2021.











- Sediment Mounding above 0.00' NAVD 88 adjacent to Mariners Cove seawall from Stations 67+00 – 69+00 (200 feet)
- Mound is comprised of poorly graded fine brown sand.



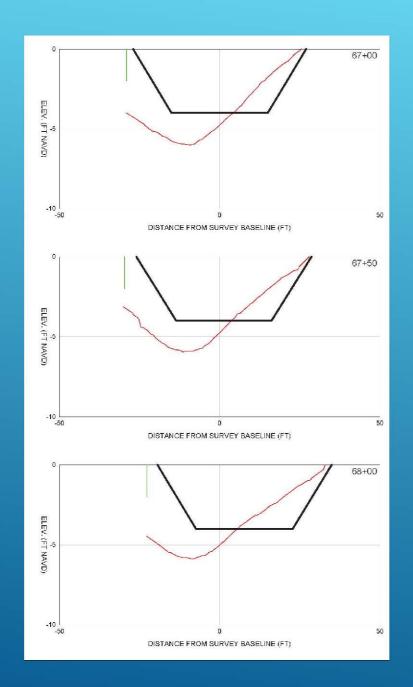


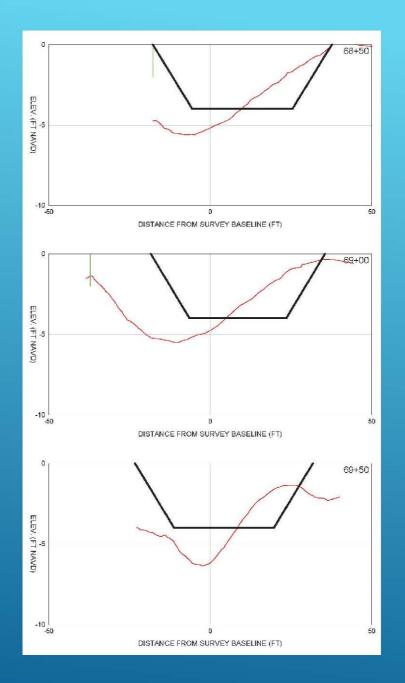


- Sediment mounding around end of seawall located at Station 62+00.
- Mound is comprised of poorly graded fine brown sand.













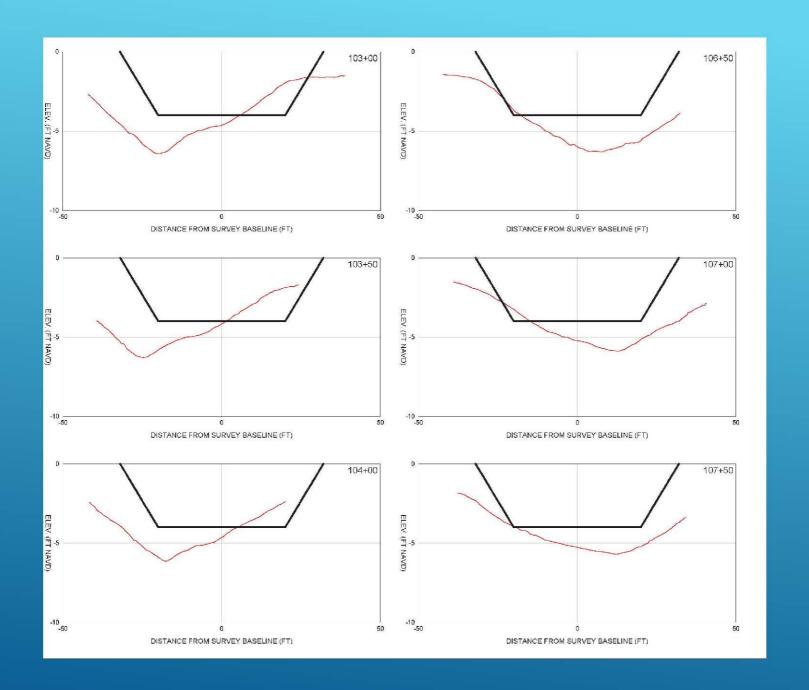
- This reach of the river currently is currently navigable under normal tidal conditions, however there are areas where sediment is built up on the banks the river.
- ▶ It is recommended to include this area in the permitted template.

- The reach from Stations 90+00 to 118+00 (Holiday Drive Canal to eastern limits of Estero River Heights) has point sources of sedimentation.
- Pelican Sound sediment mound is comprised of poorly graded fine light brownish gray sand.





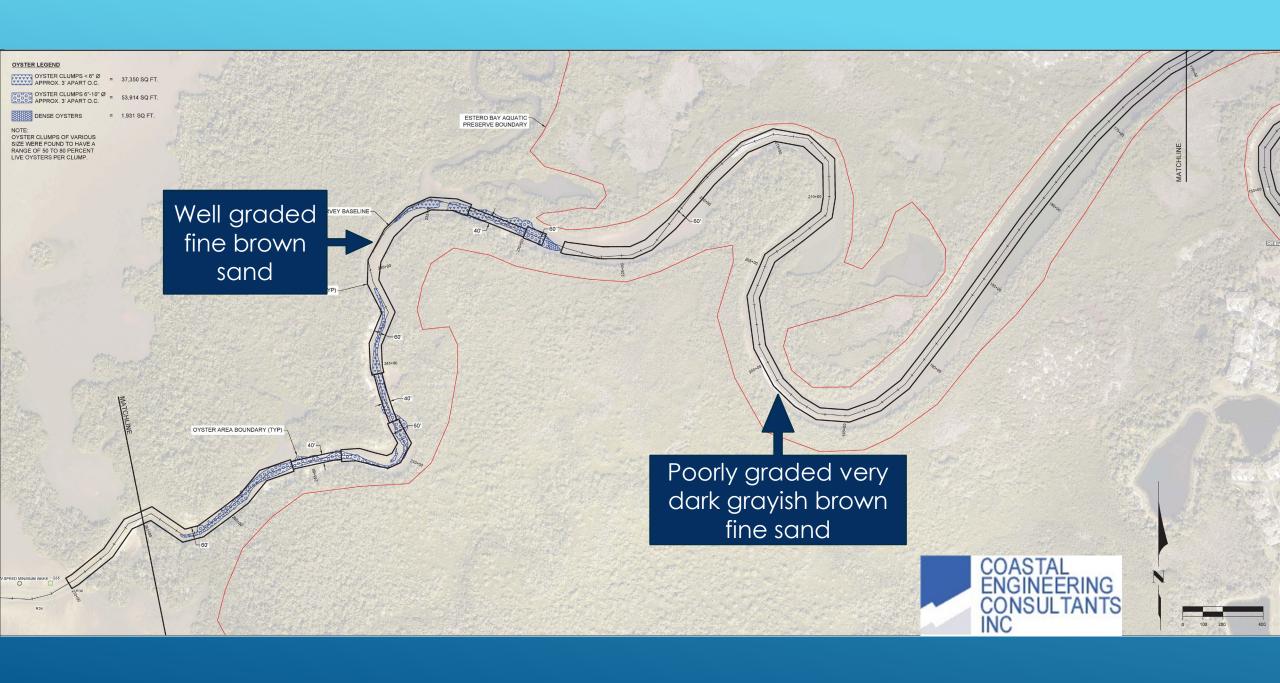


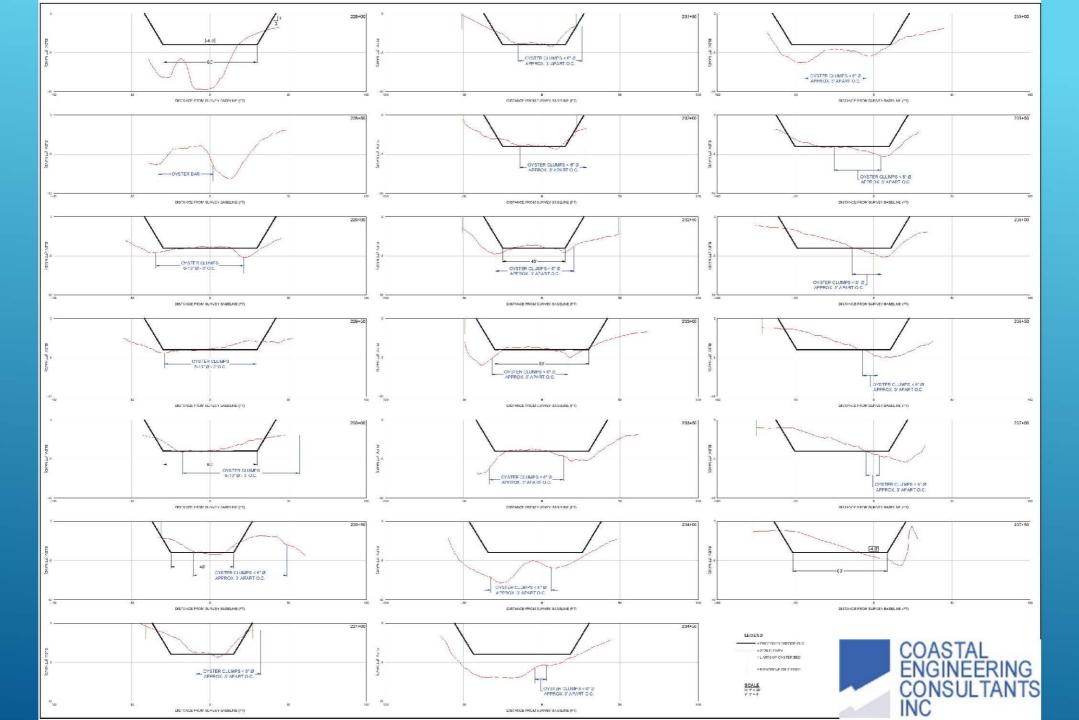




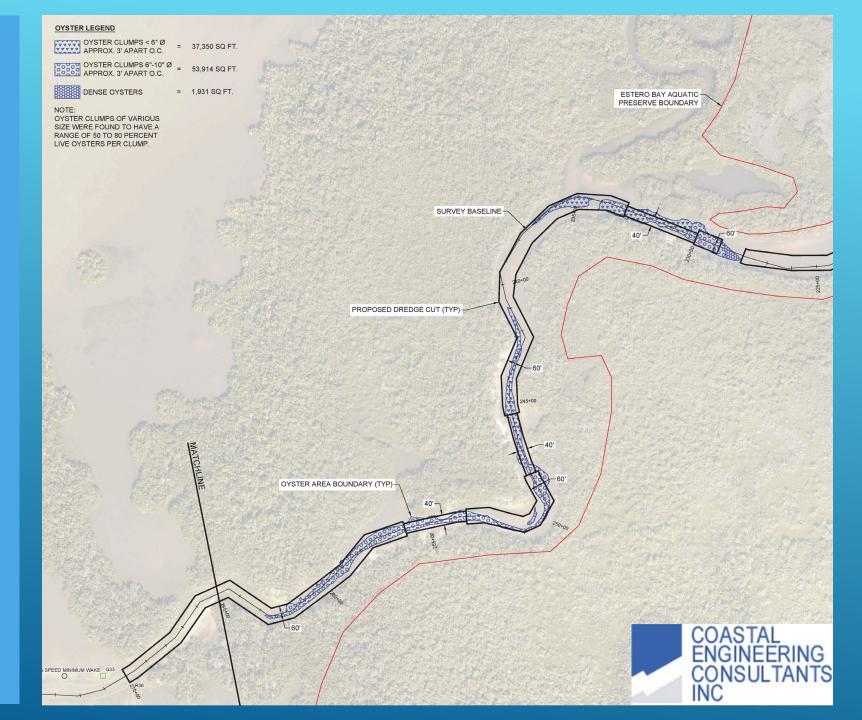








- 90% of proposed dredge volume is within Estero Bay Aquatic Preserve.
- Conducted environmental resource survey.
 - Total area of sparse oyster clumps was 2.1 acres.
 - Approximately 1 acre of oysters are above -4.0' NAVD 88.
 - Sizes of clumpsvaried, largest is10" diameter.
 - Clumps spaced roughly3' apart on center.
 - Approximately 50-80%
 of oysters were live in each clump.
 - No other resources impacted.

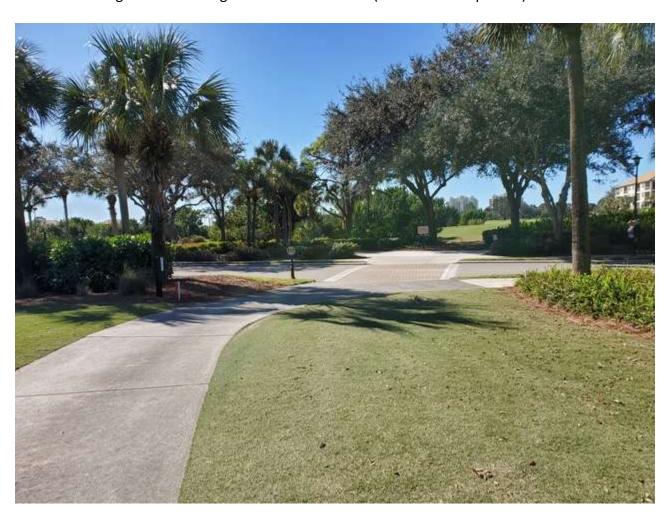

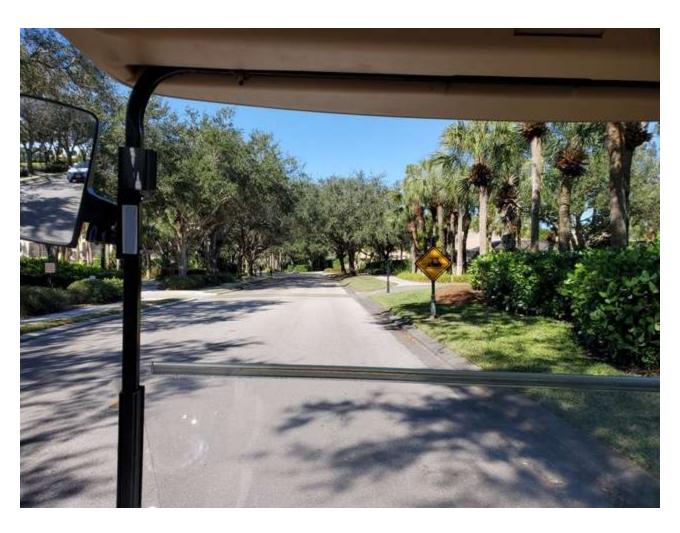
I think the right of way between Pelican Sound Drive and the Cross walk at #9 River should be clearer.

Currently, the golf carts have a stop sign, and the Automobile drivers have only a sign that has a picture of a golf cart.

Currently I believe that it is generally understood that the cars yield to carts protruding into the crosswalk, but it is not stated. Since cars are supposed to yield to pedestrians in the crosswalk, I would think that the same would apply to Golf Carts.

A clearer message would be a sign which states "Yield (with Golf Cart picture)".

DEAR RESIDENT,

You are receiving this newsletter, as our records indicate that you own property or live within the boundaries of the River Ridge Community Development District (CDD). This includes Pelican Sound, The Meadows and the commercial strip along US 41. We would like to take this opportunity to update you on the business of the District.



2020 Accomplishments

2020 was another very busy year for the CDD, which accomplished numerous tasks, including the following:

STORM WATER MANAGEMENT SYSTEM

The interconnecting pipes between the lakes and wetlands, as well as the flow control structures were fully inspected and areas needing cleanout were addressed. This program will continue to be conducted on an annual basis, each spring, and before the rainy season begins. In 2020 the water management system concrete discharge structure at the northwest end of Lakes #3 golf hole, the inflow to the driving range lake, and the inflow to the lake next to the new park were modified to improve the storm water system levels and discharge rates. These changes have been operating successfully.

Did You Know?

- The CDD encompasses approximately 629.46 acres.
- The CDD owns and operates 14 stormwater lakes encompassing 70 acres, 16 wetlands encompassing 46 acres and a dry detention system encompassing 18 acres.
- The CDD owns and maintains the roads, gutters and sidewalks within Pelican Sound. (paid for solely by Pelican Sound residents)
- The CDD also owns roadside landscaping and street lighting along Pelican Sound Drive from US 41 to the gatehouse. (paid for by all residents of the CDD)
- The CDD owns the roadside landscaping and street lighting and residential irrigation supply within Pelican Sound, however, these facilities are maintained by the Pelican Sound Golf and River Club by agreement with the CDD.

This and That

We frequently receive complaints regarding the right of way, roadside trees, trash, signage and walls along the road south of Pelican Sound Drive that serves the business commercial strip. Though these properties are within the CDD, the road and associated facilities are privately owned and are not the responsibility of the CDD.

LAKES

The District has also been working closely with its lake maintenance contractor in exploring new ways to control algae growth, reduce sediment buildup on the bottom



and improve the overall health of the lake. In this regard, the CDD has leased and installed a bio generator on one of our lakes. A bio generator grows strains of good bacteria and releases that bacteria into the lake. on a daily basis. The bacteria strains are the same as those that are already naturally occurring within the lake; so, the generator serves to enhance the population. The enhanced population improves the lakes effectiveness in the water quality following storm events, while decreasing the frequency of chemical applications to address unwanted growth, such as algae. The bacteria should also aid in reducing sediment buildup in the bottom of the lake and reduce the need to dredge the lake in the future, which, of course, can be a very costly and impactful project. The bio generator has been in place for approximately two years, and we will continue to monitor its performance and, if deemed successful, may be looking to install in other lakes in the future. Additionally, the District has installed three Nano Bubbler systems in our lakes to saturate the water column with oxygen, to improve water quality, and to control algae and cyanobacteria. Nanobubbles are negatively charged oxygen-enriched molecules that react with harmful organic substances in the water (i.e., excess nutrients, anaerobic bacteria, metals, pollutants) to render them inactive as fuel for nuisance algae growth or as a source of undesirable water quality conditions.

Roadway Pavers

Phase I of the Paver Brick repairs, replacement and additions project has been completed. This phase addressed numerous areas throughout Pelican Sound.

Bank Restoration Projects

100 feet of the FPL drainage ditch was excavated and rip/rap was installed to prevent sediment from impeding flow.

Traffic Calming

River Ridge and Pelican Sound continue to work together on traffic calming. As part of the effort, River Ridge purchased the two radar speed signs located throughout the community in 2019. The signs are operated by the Pelican Sound Staff.

2021 Budget & Project Initiatives

As we are sure many of you in Pelican Sound are aware, having received and likely paid your property taxes by now, the CDD increased the Special Revenue Fund operating budget and assessments by nearly \$85.00; which is intended to address a significant amount of concrete and paver brick repairs at the Corkscrew entry and round-a-bout.

Phase II will replace/restore Corkscrew entrance and circle; replace/restore Pinehurst entrance; and add pavers to the Hammock Greens entrance as a joint project with Hammock Greens.

INFRASTRUCTURE AGING

Within Pelican Sound most of the infrastructure e.g. roads, street gutters, sidewalks, storm water management system, community and golf course irrigation systems, lakes, roadside landscaping, street lighting, gate houses and exterior fencing are over 20 years old.

Many of those items are requiring increased maintenance with an increase in expenses. In addition, many of the items are severely out of date and technological advances are such that replacement of those items would be far more cost effective. Replacement will improve efficiency and reduce operational costs.

River Ridge and Pelican Sound managements are developing an Infrastructure Long Range Plan to address these issues. The goal is to maintain the system performance and take advantage of state-of-the-art advances where beneficial while at the same time keeping a relatively smooth budget profile.

Updates: SOLitude Lake Management

Mrs. Adams presented Resolution 2021-04.

On MOTION by Mr. Blumenthal and seconded by Mr. Schultz, with all in favor, Resolution 2021-04, Expressing its Sympathy for the Untimely Passing of James (Jim) Dougherty; Acknowledging and Recognizing his Work and Contributions to the District and the Pelican Sound Community, was adopted.

FIFTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Mr. Kurth thanked the Board for adopting Resolution 2021-04 and gave the following update:

- 73 Stocking grass carp in several lakes was researched.
 - The recommendation was to not pursue a permit to stock the lakes with grass carp because Mr. Kurth did not feel confident that the weirs could be re-designed and it would be very difficult to put up easily maintained barriers to prevent the grass carp from escaping because of lake interconnects piping.
 - > SOLitude would be changing submerged weed treatments in some lakes. Sonar would be used to control the slender spikerush in Lake H1-B.

- Algae in Lake H1-B was easier to control due to use of a bacteria grower and the nanobubbler machine, which mitigates some of the nutrients.
- The technician assigned to the District has been replaced due to poor work performance. The new technician is more effective and sprayed the grasses, throughout the system, and was working on submersible algae.
 - Lake H1-A had significant chara and bladderwort growth. The chara was treated with a submersible cutter and a loading rake and subsequently sprayed; the bladderwort would be addressed next. Once the bladderwort is under control, Lake H1-A will look 100% better.
 - Most of the lakes were in very good shape and the problematic lakes would be treated within the next month.

Mrs. Adams asked if Lakes H1-A and H1-B were being treated with Sonar. Mr. Kurth replied affirmatively and stated that prefers to use Sonar, in communities with beneficial plants. It is a low toxic herbicide, is very thorough and helps with long-term control.

A Board Member noted that, Resolutions on the CDD website, in the document section, had black areas, as if redacted. Mrs. Adams would inform the Administrative Staff of the issue.

SIXTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Discussion/Consideration of M.R.I. Construction, Inc., Revised Proposal for Cleanout of Sediment in Drainage Ditch Adjacent to FPL Easement

<u>Lake/Wetland Review:</u> Last review conducted was on November 6th. Staff reported River's dry retention area at Hole 4 overgrown with weeds which is treated quarterly as specified in Solitudes contract. Staff confirmed with Wetlands District Manager the first treatment for 2021 is scheduled for the week of January 25th. Staff has scheduled the next review of Sound, Lakes, and River courses for Monday, February 8th.

<u>Landscape Review:</u> Landscape review has been scheduled for February 5th. The last Pelican Sound/41 entry review was held on January 9th. Observations included areas with large ant hills along curbing, North and South ROW's. Also observed fifteen – twenty Duranta shrubs that require replacement from white- fly at median end caps of Pelican Sound and Taft Ct. intersection. These observations have been provided to contractor for scheduling, staff will follow up to ensure they are completed.
